## Introduction

This document presents the Content Development Policy for the School of Medicine. It includes a description of the Library's existing collections and an outline of current collecting areas.

Set within the context provided by an overall [Content Development Policy](#) (and a related [Collection Management Policy](#)), its purpose is to ensure that the selection of resources - books, journals, and other kinds of material – whether print, electronic or other format, reflect the teaching and research priorities of the School and provide best value in both financial and academic terms.

## Collection evaluation

The Library has substantial collections in all fields of medicine, and includes books and journals, in both print and digital formats. The principal collection of printed books, including all reading list items, is kept on Blue 2 in the Main Library but a significant collection of duplicate copies of undergraduate core texts and supplementary reading is also housed in the Stopford Library on the third floor of the Stopford Building.

The majority of Medicine books are shelved between 610 and 618. The main classification sequences are as follows:

## Special Collections

The Library actively collects Special Collections material in this area, and regards acquisitions in this area as a high priority, whether by gift, bequest, purchase or loan.

JRUL has nationally significant collections, both printed and archival, relating to the history of medicine. Printed collections provide a rich representation of works on medicine from the Renaissance to the 20th century. Collectively they constitute probably the largest and most comprehensive holdings of printed material relating to the history of medicine in the North of England.

The Library also has significant medical archives, which are particularly strong for the North West England, including the Manchester Medical Collection, and archives of local medical societies and medical practitioners.

The strengths of the Rylands' collections provide primary source materials which support research into a range of subjects, particularly:

- Renaissance and early modern medicine;
- Renaissance editions of classical medical texts;
- Pharmacopeia and herbals;
- Medical illustration and art;
- History of the medical profession, particularly in North West England, including biography and prosopography;
- Medical education since the 18th century;
- Medical specialisms, including anatomy, surgery, public health and radiology;
- History of medicine in the Greater Manchester region including the interrelationships with social, economic, urban and intellectual histories;
- Biomedical research and laboratory medicine;
- Birth control and eugenics.

Collection strengths are also described in the content development policy for the History of Science, Technology and Medicine, and in the Medical Archives collecting policy.

## Bookfund and resource allocations

Bookfunds are allocated in June/July each year for the following financial year (August – July). This bookfund is to provide for all non-subscription library materials including printed

extbooks and research monographs, electronic books, and any other one-off purchase requirements.

Journals and other subscription items are purchased from a separate fund which at present accounts for over 85% of the cost of all purchases.

## Document Supply Service and Inter-Library Loans

Although the Library will try to accommodate all requests for purchase, books which lie outside the areas listed above or are out of print can be obtained on loan from another library through the [Document Supply / Inter-Library Loans Service](#) (DS/ILL). Such books are usually borrowable for up to 6 weeks at a time. Journal articles and other material not available from within the Library's collections can also be obtained through this service.

## Teaching and Learning

The Library will support all taught course modules.

Multiple copies and / or electronic copies of texts will be purchased or subscribed to as appropriate. Subject to copyright restrictions the Library will digitise materials, for instance book chapters, or journal articles not otherwise available electronically, if required for taught course modules.

Reading lists and estimated student numbers should be sent to the Faculty Team Librarian by July 31 and November 1 each year so any new material can be purchased and processed in time for the forthcoming semester.

Reading lists will be added to or updated in the Library's online [Link2Lists](#) service: each list is embedded into Blackboard through the module code. For traditional bibliographic references to print material, e-books and journal articles, this links directly through to entries in the Library catalogue. Using the new Link2Lists software, tutors can add hyperlinks to audio files, video clips, podcasts etc. to provide students with multimedia **resource lists**. Academic staff interested in using Link2Lists software (rather than a traditional word processing package) to create lists, or in being able to update their lists throughout the academic year, should contact Library staff for training and support.

Reading list texts can be 7-day loan or put into the [High Demand Collection](#) from where they can be borrowed for shorter periods of one or two nights.

## Digitisation

Subject to copyright restrictions the Library will digitise material according to its **Error! Hyperlink reference not valid..** Priorities include reading list items – book chapters or journal papers – and items from Special Collections.

## Manchester e-Scholar

The University's institutional repository, [Manchester eScholar](#), manages and disseminates the intellectual outputs of the university. Since the beginning of 2010 all accepted PhD theses have been added to the repository.

## Stock editing

Most stock is kept on the Library's open shelves. As space is at a premium, especially in the Main Library, periodic weeding is used to remove less well used material to store from where

it can be retrieved usually within one working day. [Store](#) requests are submitted online or by email.

Unused duplicates are disposed of from time to time.

Weeding and withdrawal criteria are described in the [Weeding Policy \(draft\)](#). Additionally, Medicine book stock is reviewed regularly to ensure that current best evidence is reflected in the editions available on the open shelves. Normally this means that the two most recent editions are available on the open shelves with older editions being relegated to Store.

## Donations

Offers of donations are welcome, but they can normally only be considered for acceptance if they are within the collection areas detailed above.

Other factors taken into account in deciding upon acceptance are listed in the [Collection Management Policy](#).

## Recommendations

The Library welcomes recommendations for the purchase of books from staff and students of the School. Purchases are normally made if:

- Recommendations fall within the scope of the policy as described above;
- Funds are available;
- The item is not already in stock.

Usually:

- Only a single copy only of a printed book is purchased;
- Books must normally be written in English;
- They must be of an appropriate academic standard.

For reading list texts, multiple copies and electronic versions will be considered as appropriate.

Recommendations can be made directly to the Faculty Team Librarian.

Journal recommendations are considered twice a year in March and November. Because of the forward financial commitment involved journal subscriptions usually have to be balanced by savings elsewhere in the subscription budget. Recommendations should be made through the School Library Representative or directly to the Faculty Team Librarian.

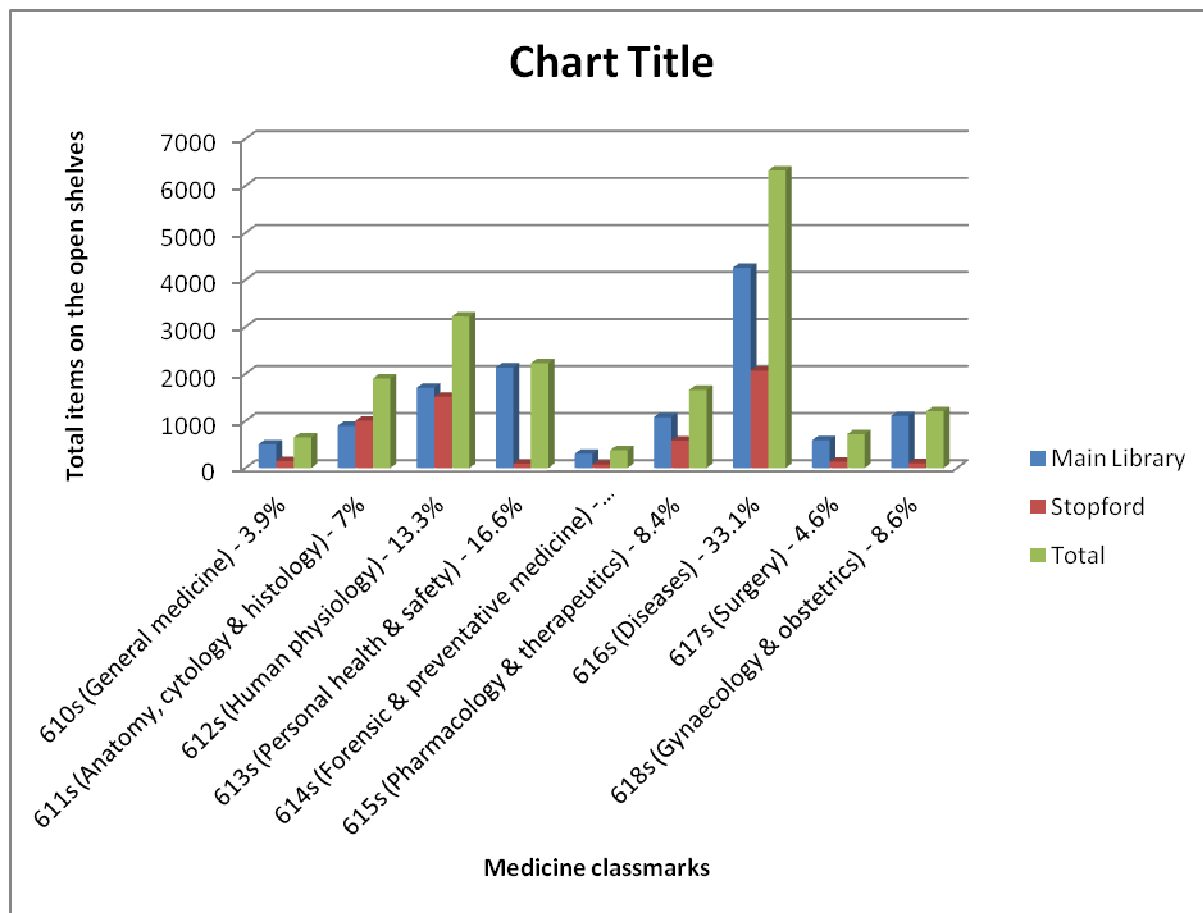


Figure 1: Total Medicine stock on the open Library shelves in both the Main Library and the Stopford Library purchased on the Medical book fund for publication years 2000 – 2011, arranged by classmark (many of the titles are held as multiple copies)

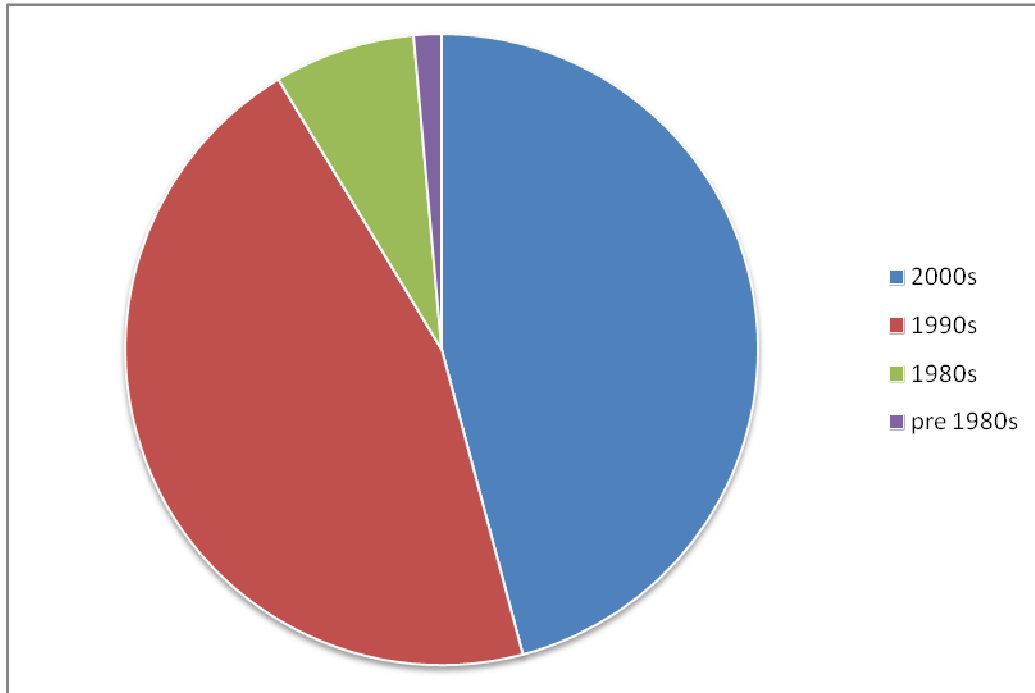


Figure 2: Total Medical stock on the Library open shelves sorted by publication year.

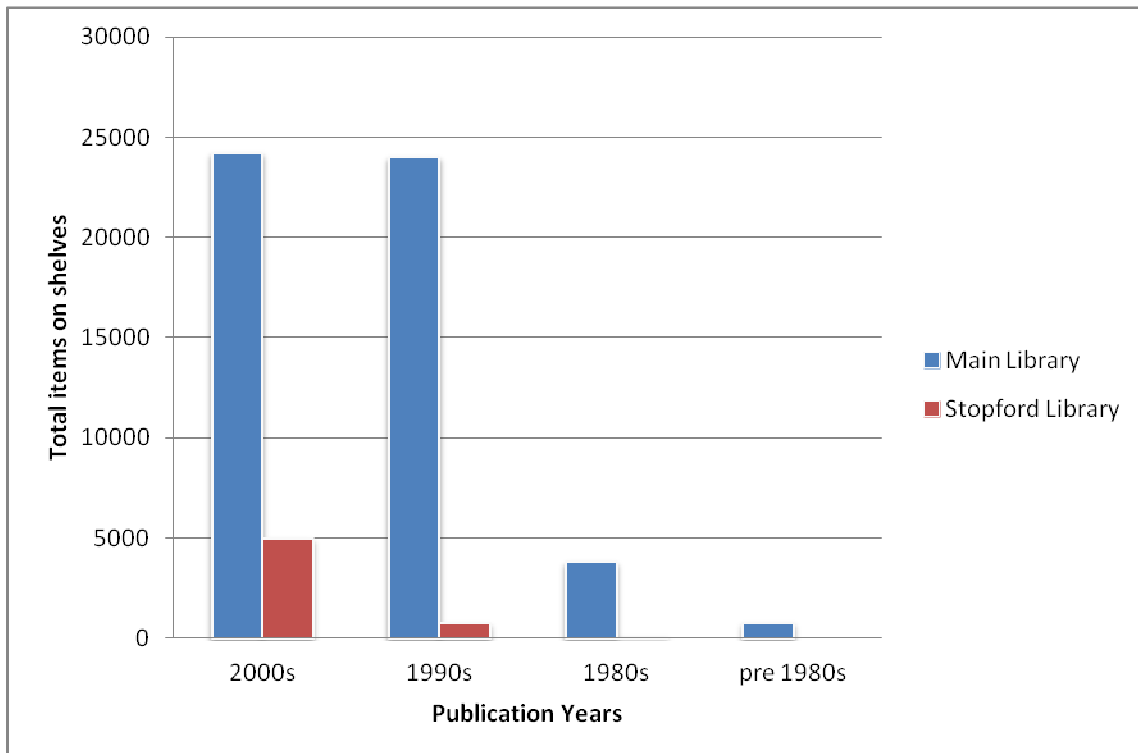


Figure 3: Comparison of numbers of medical books in the Main Library and the Stopford Library by publication year.

## Appendix 2: Books purchased on the Medicine Content Budget (204) in the financial year 2009-2010

*Approximately 250 new titles and new editions were purchased on fund code 204 in the financial year 2009 – 2010; many of them multiple copies of core texts.*

*The number of electronic books purchased on fund 204 in 90-10 is relatively low. The Library's published strategy is to purchase e-versions over print wherever possible and in the area of Medicine this is expected to show a significant rise in 2010-2011 as more electronic versions become available for purchase.*

*It is worth noting that a number of e-book collections have been purchased through subscription in 2009 - 2010 contributing to the developing e-book collections. Main subscription suppliers in Medicine e-books are STAT!Ref, Ovid ebooks, Springer books, Medicines Complete and Elsevier Science Direct Books. Individual titles are purchased largely*

## Appendix 3: Other Subscriptions

### Bibliographical Databases

#### Core Medical Databases:

##### Medline (OVID SP – 1948 – present)

Medline is one of the most important biomedical databases. It is produced by the National Library of Medicine (USA) and covers the international literature on biomedicine, including the allied health fields and the biological and physical sciences, humanities, and information science as they relate to medicine and health care. Information is indexed from approximately 5,400 journals published world-wide. It corresponds to the printed source *Index Medicus* which can be used to trace older literature.

##### Embase (OVID SP – 1980 – present; Elsevier 1974 – present)

The *Excerpta Medica* database (EMBASE) produced by Elsevier, is a major biomedical and pharmaceutical database indexing over 3,500 international journals in the following fields: drug research, pharmacology, pharmaceuticals, toxicology, clinical and experimental human medicine, health policy and management, public health, occupational health, environmental health, drug dependence and abuse, psychiatry, forensic medicine, and biomedical engineering/instrumentation. There is selective coverage for nursing, dentistry, veterinary medicine, psychology, and alternative medicine. EMBASE is one of the most widely used biomedical and pharmaceutical databases because of its currency and in-depth indexing. Frequent updates allow access to the latest medical and pharmacological trends. Approximately 375,000 records are added yearly.

##### Cochrane Library (OVID SP; Wiley Interscience)

Created by the Cochrane Collaboration to address the need to aid the clinical decision making process through evidence based practice, it contains seven separate databases:

- **The Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews (CDSR):** The CDSR contains two types of document: Cochrane Reviews and Cochrane Protocols. Cochrane Reviews are full-text systematic reviews which provide an overview of the effects of interventions in health care. Cochrane Protocols provide information about reviews which are currently being written.
- **The Database of Abstracts of Reviews of Effects (DARE):** DARE contains structured abstracts of high-quality systematic reviews published in the scientific literature.
- **The Cochrane Central Register of Controlled Trials (CENTRAL):** CENTRAL is a bibliography of publications which report on controlled trials.
- **The Cochrane Database of Methodology Reviews (CDMR):** The CDMR contains two types of document: Cochrane Methodology Reviews and Protocols. Cochrane Methodology Reviews are full-text systematic reviews of methodological studies. Protocols provide place-markers for reviews which are currently being written.
- **The Cochrane Methodology Register (CMR):** CMR is a bibliography of publications which report on methods used in the conduct of controlled trials.
- **The Health Technology Assessment Database (HTA):** This database contains information on healthcare technology assessments (defined as prevention and rehabilitation, vaccines, pharmaceuticals and devices, medical and surgical procedures and the systems within which health is protected and maintained).
- **The NHS Economic Evaluation Database (NHS EED):** This database contains structured abstracts of articles describing economic evaluations of health care interventions.

##### PsycINFO (OVID SP – 1806 – present)

**PsycINFO** is a bibliographic database produced by the American Psychological Association providing abstracts and citations to the scholarly literature in the psychological, social, behavioural, and health sciences. Updated weekly, PsycINFO provides access to journal articles, books, chapters, and dissertations.

## **General Science:**

### **ISI Web of Knowledge**

Consists of seven databases containing information gathered from over 8,000 journals, books, book series, reports and conference reports. The databases include the Science Citation Index Expanded (1945 – present). It has strong coverage in the medical sciences and related disciplines. Medical sciences can be searched either on their own or by cross searching across subject disciplines – e.g the medical and social sciences – which can provide unique results on occasion. Web of Science also provides the ability to search conference proceedings post 1990. Relevant databases are:

The Citation Indexes provide details of articles from over 8,000 journals. Abstracts are provided for more recent material. In addition to conventional searching (by subject, author etc) it is possible to undertake citation searches. Conference Proceedings cover the proceedings of international conferences, symposia, seminars, workshops and conventions.

- **BIOSIS Previews (1969 to date)**

The database contains references and abstracts of articles published in about 5,000 life sciences journals, plus details of conference proceedings, review articles and books. All areas of the life sciences are covered, from traditional areas of biology such as botany, zoology and microbiology to related fields such as pharmacology, ecology and experimental clinical medicine.

- **Journal Citation Reports (2000 to date)**

The database provides information on the frequency with which a journal has been cited (Impact Factor), which journals are cited most often, the publications cited by a journal and how soon after publication a journal is being cited (Immediacy Index). The number of journal publication years going back from the current year which account for 50% of the total citations received by the cited journal in the current year (Cited Half-Life) is also provided.

### **Scopus:**

Scopus is another database that allows cross searching across subject areas, covering some 12,000 journals from all aspects of science, technology and medicine, with 6,800 titles in health sciences and 100% Medline coverage.

## Specialist Databases:

### AgeInfo:

AgeInfo is an information service about old age and ageing provided by the Library and Information Service of the Centre for Policy on Ageing. AgeInfo provides the following searchable databases:

- A bibliographic database of over 40,000 books, articles and reports from the specialist collection on Social Gerontology held at the Centre for Policy on Ageing.
- Detailed information about over 4,000 organisations active in the field of Old Age and Ageing from the United Kingdom, Europe and World-Wide.
- An international Calendar of Events listing courses, conferences, meetings, training sessions and other events soon to take place in the field of Ageing and Old Age.

### AMED – Allied and Complementary Medicine Database (OVID SP – 1985 – present)

AMED, compiled by The British Library, indexes articles from about 600 mainly European journals in the fields of complementary medicine, palliative care and professions allied to medicine. It covers a broad range of subjects including complementary medicine, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, rehabilitation, podiatry, palliative care and speech and language therapy.

### British Nursing Index (OVID SP – 1985 – present)

The British Nursing Index database is a bibliographic database that indexes articles from the most popular English language nursing journal published primarily in the UK. It is a comprehensive index covering all aspects of nursing, midwifery and community healthcare from 1994 to the present, and is updated monthly.

### Cancerlit in PubMed

CancerLit is produced by the National Cancer Institute in the US. It indexes about 200 core journals together with other sources including the proceedings of meetings, government reports, symposia reports, theses and selected monographs. It covers all aspects of cancer therapy, chemical, viral and other cancer-causing agents, mechanisms of carcinogenesis, the biochemistry, immunology and physiology of cancer and mutagen and growth factor studies.

### Cinahl Plus (Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature – EBSCO – 1937 – date)

CINAHL Plus provides indexing for 3,802 journals from the fields of nursing and allied health back to 1937. It covers English-language journals and other publications on nursing, biomedicine, health sciences librarianship, alternative/complementary medicine, consumer health and other allied health disciplines. In addition to journals, the database covers health care books, nursing dissertations, selected conference proceedings, standards of practice, educational software, audiovisual materials and Evidence-Based Care Sheets. Full text material includes nearly 80 journals plus legal cases, clinical innovations, critical paths, drug records, research instruments and clinical trials. The service also includes the Pre-CINAHL dataset. This provides basic bibliographic information about journal articles before they are indexed with CINAHL headings and serves as a current awareness service.

### HIV InSiteKnowledge Base

HIV InSite Knowledge Base (which includes materials from the third edition of the AIDS Knowledge Base) is a Web-based textbook published by the University of California, San Francisco and San Francisco General Hospital. Contents cover natural history, transmission, testing, pathogenesis, clinical spectrum, clinical manifestations and management of HIV infection. Also included is coverage of infections and malignancies associated with HIV.

## **HMIC - Health Management Information Consortium (OVID SP – 1979 – present)**

HMIC covers UK and overseas health management periodicals, monographs and reports. It comprises:
