## Introduction

This document presents the Content Development Policy for Linguistics and English Language. It includes a description of the Library's existing collections and an outline of current collecting areas.

Set within the context provided by an overall Content Development Policy and a related Collection Management Policy, its purpose is to ensure that the selection of resources - books, journals, and other kinds of material – whether print, electronic or of other format, reflect the teaching and research priorities of the School and provide best value in both financial and academic terms.

## Collection Evaluation

The Library has substantial collections in all fields of Linguistics and English Language, including books and journals, in print and digital formats. The principal collection of printed books, including all reading list items, is kept on Blue 3 or in High Demand on Blue Ground in the Main Library.

*Appendix 1* provides an overview of the books in Linguistics and English Language by broad subject areas.

*Appendix 2* lists the books purchased from the Linguistics and English Language bookfund during the 2009-10 financial year, excluding items purchase as part of other subscriptions.

*Appendix 3* lists current journal subscriptions in the area of Linguistics and English Language. It is not necessarily a complete list as there are difficulties in deciding on what constitutes a Linguistics and English Language journal. However all journal holdings and subscriptions are listed in the Library catalogue, and all subscriptions to electronic journals are listed in the E-Journals A-Z listing.

*Appendix 4* lists other relevant subscriptions to bibliographic databases and indexes in and around the subject area.

*Appendix 5* presents a general overview of subject related material contained within the Library's Special Collections (Deansgate).

## Bookfund and Resource Allocations

This bookfund is to provide for all non-subscription library materials including printed textbooks and research monographs, electronic books, and any other one-off purchase requirements.

Journals and other subscription items are purchased from a separate fund which at present accounts for over 85% of the cost of all purchases.

The Library does not actively collect Special Collections material specifically relevant to this subject area and purchases of material are generally considered a low priority. However, many of our purchases, deposits or donations are written in English, and are therefore of significance to the study of the history and development of the English language. Donations or deposit of material to supplement existing strengths would be considered.

## Document Supply Service

Although the Library will try to accommodate all requests for purchase, books which lie outside the areas listed above or are out of print can be obtained on loan from another library through the Document Supply Service. Such books are usually borrowable for up to 6 weeks at a time. Journal articles and other material not available from within the Library's collections can also be obtained through this service.

## Teaching and Learning

The Library will support all taught course modules.

Multiple copies and / or electronic copies of texts will be purchased or subscribed to as appropriate. Subject to copyright restrictions (see below, under Digitisation) the Library will digitise materials not otherwise available electronically – for instance book chapters, or journal articles – if required for taught course modules.

Reading lists and estimated student numbers should be sent to the Faculty Team Librarian by July 31 and December 31 each year so any new material can be purchased and processed in time for the forthcoming semester.

The library's software package *Link2Lists* affords the opportunity of creating multi-media **resource lists**. Hyperlinks to audio files, video clips, podcasts and the like can all be included in a resource list alongside traditional bibliographic references to print material, e-books and journal articles, which can link directly through to entries in the Library catalogue. Library staff can provide training and support to academic staff interested in using Link2Lists software rather than a traditional word processing package, and embedding resource lists into Blackboard modules.

Access to reading list texts can be further increased by the use of the 7-day loan period option (which protects them from external borrowers) or by transferring items into the High Demand Collection from where they can be borrowed for shorter periods.

## Digitisation

Subject to copyright restrictions the Library will digitise material according to its Digitisation Strategy. Priorities include reading list items – book chapters or journal papers – and items from Special Collections. The University holds a Copyright Licencing Agency (CLA) Higher Education Comprehensive Scanning Licence: which covers most UK / US publications but many other countries are excluded.

## Manchester e-Scholar

The University's institutional repository, Manchester eScholar, manages and disseminates the intellectual outputs of the university. Since the beginning of 2010 all accepted PhD theses have been added to the repository.

## Stock Editing

Most stock is kept on the Library's open shelves. As space is at a premium, especially in the Main Library, periodic weeding is used to remove less-well used material to store from where it can be retrieved usually within one working day.

Unused duplicates are disposed of from time to time.

Weeding and withdrawal criteria are described in the Collection Management Policy.

## Donations

Offers of donations are welcome, but they can normally only be considered for acceptance if they are within the collection areas detailed above.

Other factors taken into account in deciding upon acceptance are listed in the Collection Management Policy.

## Recommendations

The Library welcomes recommendations for the purchase of books from staff and students of the School. Purchases are normally made if:

- Recommendations fall within the scope of the policy as described above;
- Funds are available;
- The item is not already in stock.

Usually:

- Only a single copy of any printed book is purchased;
- They must be of an appropriate academic standard.

For reading list texts, multiple copies and electronic versions will be considered as appropriate. Recommendations can be made directly to the Faculty Team Librarian.

Journal recommendations are considered twice a year (May/June and November). Because of the forward financial commitment involved journal subscriptions usually have to be balanced by savings elsewhere in the subscription budget. Recommendations should be made through the Discipline's Library Representative.

## Appendix 1: Stock Overview

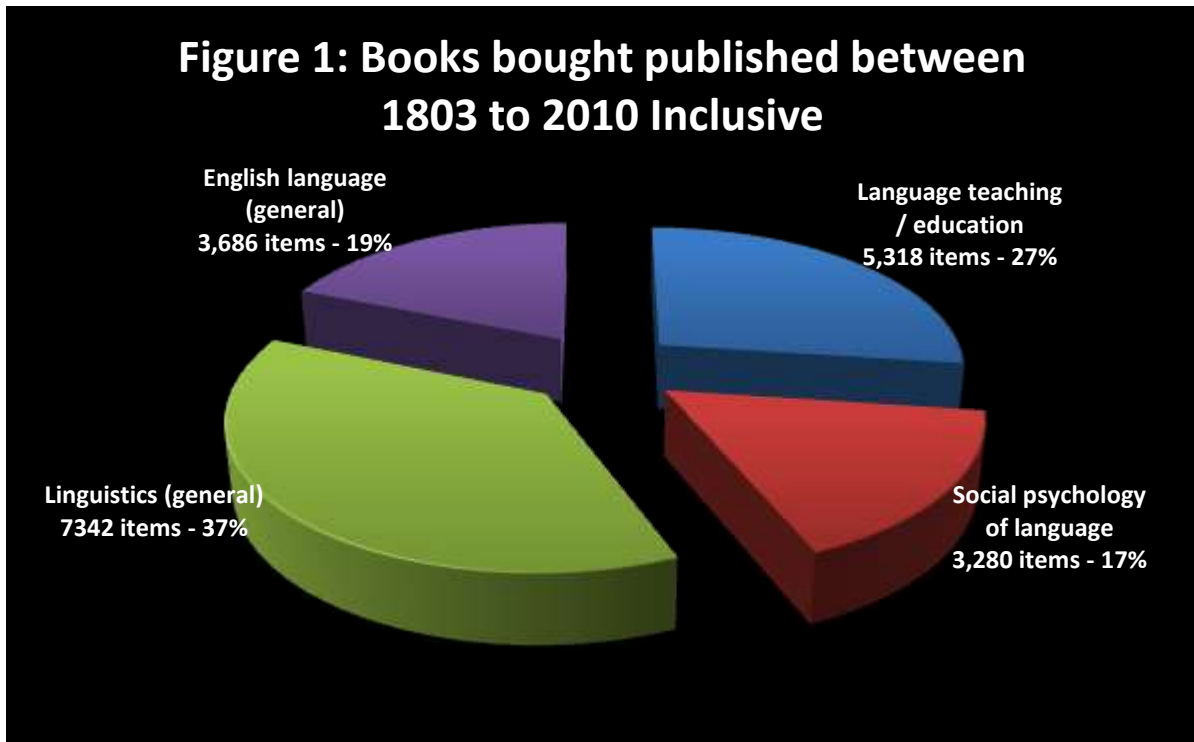
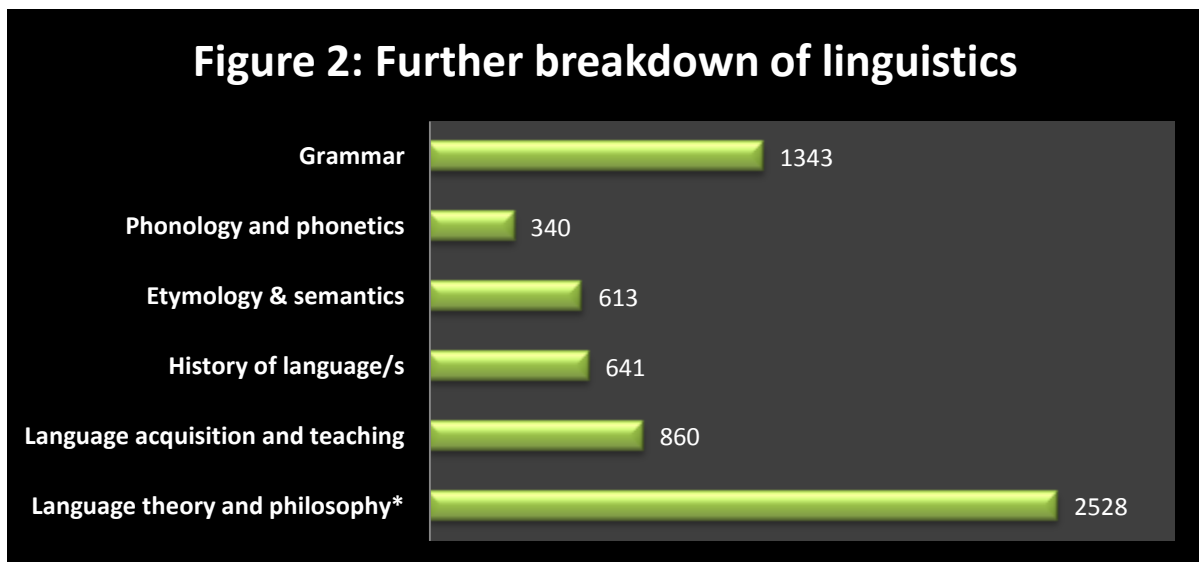
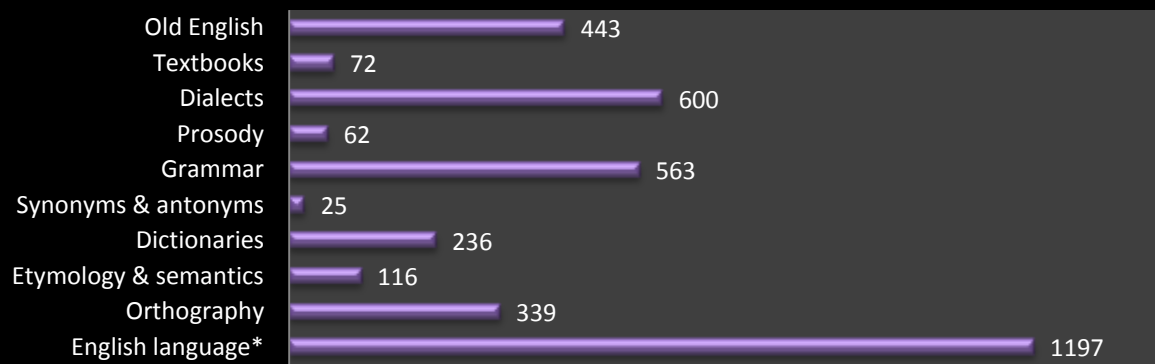


Figure 1 (above) provides a very general overview of stock and highlights existing areas of strength within the collection. Figures 2 & 3 (below) go a little deeper and draw out strong subdivisions from within the collection as a whole.

## Appendix 4: Indexes and databases

In addition to journal subscriptions, the Library subscribes to a number of indexes and databases relevant to Linguistics and English Language.

Those specific to Linguistics and English Language include:

- **Linguistics and Language Behavior Abstracts:** This database abstracts and indexes the international literature in linguistics and related disciplines in the language sciences. The database covers all aspects of the study of language including phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax and semantics.
- **Atlas of North American English:** The Atlas of North American English provides the first overall view of the pronunciation and vowel systems of the dialects of the U.S. and Canada. The Atlas re-defines the regional dialects of American English on the basis of sound changes active in the 1990s and draws new boundaries reflecting those changes.
- **Cognitive Linguistics Bibliography:** The Cognitive Linguistics Bibliography database consists of over 7000 entries covering a wide range of subjects within the field of cognitive linguistics. Abstracts are provided for most of the entries in the bibliography. The Bibliography covers purely linguistic publications and also the application of cognitive linguistics theories in other related fields such as pragmatics, poetics, sociolinguistics, anthropology, literary studies and applied linguistics.
- **Handbook of Varieties of English:** The Handbook of Varieties of English provides an overview of the morphology and syntax of varieties of English from around the world.
- **LDC-Online:** The Linguistic Data Consortium is an open consortium of universities, companies and government research laboratories. It creates, collects and distributes speech and text databases, lexicons and other resources to support research and development in human language technologies.
- **Middle English Dictionary/Compendium:** Its 15,000 pages offer a comprehensive analysis of lexicon and usage for the period 1100-1500, based on the analysis of a collection of over three million citation slips, the largest collection of this kind available.

## Appendix 5: Related resources in Special Collections

The Library's Special Collections are pre-eminent in the history of the English language and are of international significance. Key resources include:

### Samuel Johnson Collection

- There are many editions of his famous Dictionary available including the first issue of the first edition of the 1747 Plan, in which Johnson announced his intentions, and the first edition of the Dictionary (1755)
- Particular attention can be drawn to a copy of the fourth edition (1773), which was at one time owned by Sir Joshua Reynolds and contains over 250 corrections in Johnson's own hand; these were subsequently incorporated in the sixth and later editions

### English manuscripts (14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> Centuries)

- Two manuscripts of Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales* (English MSS 63, 113)
- A richly-illuminated copy of John Lydgate's *Seige of Troy*, and a copy of his translation of Boccaccio's *Falle of Pryncys* (English MSS 1–2)
- Three manuscripts of *The Pricke of Conscience*, traditionally attributed to the mystic Richard Rolle de Hampole (English MSS 50, 51, 90)
- Fifteen manuscripts of the *Wycliffite Bible*, or of parts of the *Bible*
- Six copies of the *Brut chronicle* (English MSS 102–105, 206, 207)
- A *Form of Cury*, or recipe book, compiled by the master cook to Richard II in its original vellum binding (English MS 7)

### English Incunables

- Over 60 Caxtons of which 36 are complete, and four are unique, constituting the second largest such collection in the world
- Other English printers well represented include John Lettou, William de Machlinia, Richard Pynson, Julian Notary, the Schoolmaster printer of St Albans, and Wynkyn de Worde, the copy of whose 1498 edition of *Morte Darthur* is unique; the Library also has one of the only two surviving copies of the Caxton edition of *Morte Darthur*
